Remembering David Pava

David, our good friend and past Director of Nor Cal Packards, succumbed to cancer on July 7, 2022. He remained active to the last moment, until the toll from a longer illness progressed to the point that he no longer had the physical strength to move forward.

He is survived by wife Pat, brothers Jonathan, Daniel and Alex, children Aaron, Adam and Michelle, and nine grandchildren. If you do an online search for his obituary, you will likely find the wonderful and heartfelt words of the family appearing in the *Sacramento Bee*. Here are some things we remember about David that complement those memories from the family.

He was energetic! David accomplished a lot of different things during his life and he approached each new adventure with strength and passion. Still more remarkable was his drive to succeed at these many endeavors. His friends have noted that he didn't just **do** a lot of things; he followed through and **accomplished** a lot of things. His lifetime of accomplishments sets an example for us all.

Did anyone mention old cars? At his passing he owned three wonderfully restored and tour ready vehicles, a **1936 Packard Series 1400 Sedan**, a **1929 Ford Model A Roadster Pickup**, and a **1910 Ford Model T Touring**. Driving these fine vehicles was his first pas-

sion, exhibiting and sharing them with others was a second calling.

In April, just three months ago, David and wife Pat drove their 1936 Packard over 300 miles from their estate in Shingle Springs to Mountain View and back. On their overnight outing they participated in multiple Packard events in the San Francisco Bay Area. David was extremely pleased with that trip, having recently heavily invested in the mechanicals of the Packard. With some pride, he reported that the car performed flawlessly.

Still, David did not like to sit idle. Within recent months he acquired a **1927 Ford Model TT Truck** project that he was actively restoring at his passing. The remarkable progress that he was making on the restoration came to a sudden halt in May as the burden of his illness became too great even for David's boundless energy.

His passion for old vehicles was life-long. David has owned an old car since the time he was allowed to drive them on public roads. His passion for old vehicles extended beyond automobiles to include a keen interest in steam trains and sailing vessels. His framed certification as a steam locomotive engineer was proudly displayed in his den.

Another major thread that runs through David's life was a passion for flying. Earlier he made a living as a flight instructor and used private aviation in his business activities. In recent years, he had renewed his private pilot license and flew leased aircraft for his personal enjoyment.

Being David's friend made one a better person. David's interest and high expectations helped animate others to action. We will all miss David's driving energy, encouraging presence and friendship. May he

Remembering Jack Holmes

We are sad to report the passing of long time, active member Jack Holmes. He is survived by his loving wife Merna, daughter Deanna and her family. Jack and Merna joined the Packard club more than 50 years ago and were heavily involved nearly from the start, including Jack's service as the Director of Projects for more than twenty years.

Jack and Merna attended their first national meet in 1982 in Detroit, towing their 1955 Clipper to the event. Over the years, they traveled to at least 24 more meets, often bringing their daughter Deanna and her family along. Two special highlights included their trip to the international meet in Australia and to the Packard Centennial in Warren, OH.

Locally, Jack and his family attended most Western Regions Tours and local events. Being his active and energetic self, when they joined the tour to Bishop and Manzanar in 2013, Jack tagged along with a small group who made the harrowing drive to the Bristlecone Pine Forrest at a dizzying 11,000+ feet elevation. On the trails while everyone else huffed and puffed in the thin air, Jack plowed right ahead not wanting to miss a thing—and he was in his 80s!

Jack especially enjoyed spending time with the many friends he made around the nation through the Packard Club. He visited as many private car collections as he possibly could. A special treat was riding in Bud Juneau's Helen Twelvecylinders and getting to spend time with his good friend.

Jack and Merna are best known for Merna's original condition Amethyst & Carnation 1954 Packard Pacific, affectionately known as "The Grape," which was donated several years ago to the Packard Proving Grounds.

Jack helped open the Fremont General Motors plant (now Tesla) in 1963 and worked there until he retired. Jack was a veteran of the Korean War, and just this year was able to participate in an Honor Flight to Washington, DC, where he met with other veterans.

Jack's smile, charisma and kindness will be greatly missed.


