

Remembering Bob McCoy

Bob McCoy passed away on November 17, 2023, after a long battle with cancer. He is survived by his wife Mary Jane, sons Mark and Michael and their wives, and four grandchildren. His engineering and management career spanned 30 years starting with Westinghouse and ending at Clorox.

As a long-term member of Nor Cal Packards, he served on the Board as a Technical Lead, helping members find parts and answering their questions. He never saw a swap meet he didn't like, always looking for a bargain and attended Hershey many times. He enjoyed restoring his 1936 Packard 120B 999 Convertible Coupe, which he bought at auction. The story goes he had stopped bidding on the car twice, but really wanted it. His wife told him to "Bid like you have money!" This encouraged him to bid more aggressively, and he bought the car.

He served as Scoutmaster for Danville Troop 236 and enjoyed scouting with his sons. He also volunteered at the Forest Home Farms as a tractor mechanic.

To paraphrase the classic Packard slogan, was Bob a good man? "Ask the man who knew him."


