# The Pious Pelican March - April 2010 Volume 46, No. 2 Director's Report by David Pava

Spring is here - and with it the beginning of our 2010 touring season. On March 28, there was excellent turnout for our first tour this year - the San Jose *Hysterical Historical Tour* hosted by Clint Moore. Our starting point was a beautifully restored 1880's Victorian Home owned by Manual Lima near downtown San Jose, displaying an impeccable collection of period furnishings and accessories. Our extremely well written 28 page illustrated tour booklet guided us through some wonderful historic neighborhoods, which one who is not familiar with the area would not be likely to see. A highlight for most included a visit to the restored building that was once the San Jose Packard dealership which was open for our viewing and a guided tour. Today it is the home a structural engineering firm. The tour concluded with lunch and socializing at Larry Camuso's spectacular home and backyard surrounded by our classic Packards.

I count seven more driving tours on our calendar for this year including our picnic, the Western All Region Tour headquartered in Placerville and our holiday party – so there is no excuse not to get your Packard (or in many cases Packards) on the road to join us.

Of course, you want to be sure your precious Packard is in touring condition before you set out. Most of us have the skill and knowledge to check the obvious. Is there sufficient pressure in your tires and air in your spare? Unlike tubeless tires on modern cars, our tube type tires do tend to leak a bit. Is your battery fully charged and the terminals clean? Do you have sufficient oil in your crankcase and a few extra quarts in the trunk? Is your radiator full? Coolant does boil off especially in the non-pressurized systems most of our earlier cars have. When is the last time your chassis was lubricated and the fluid levels checked in your transmission and rear axle? Are your brakes including the parking brake in good working order? It is not a bad idea to find a large vacant parking lot to test a simulated quick stop. Do your lights work – including your brake lights and turn signals if so equipped? If you do not drive your car frequently do you add fuel stabilizer when you add gas to prevent carburetor problems – as modern gas goes "stale" very quickly? Is there a fire extinguisher that will put out a gasoline fire available and accessible? I could go on – but you get my point for enjoyable, trouble free and safe touring we need to be doubly sure everything is in proper working order.

If you need technical help the club is fortunate to have multiple resources that can provide assistance. Of course the advertisers in the back of the Pious Pelican may be of assistance and there are a few other

resources that you may not be aware of. Times Passed Auto Restoration in Concord 925-825-1268 specializes in mechanical, brake and electrical repair for cars from the 30's to the 70's. Aires Restorations in the South Bay 650-948-6424 is accustomed to working on classic and antique cars. Also, John Lyons, 408-832-2685 is an ASE certified automotive technician - with mechanical and electrical experience on Packards from '31 to '54 - who will come to your home or shop at a very reasonable \$25 an hour rate. He solved a few problems for me quickly and inexpensively and in the process repaired a problem I did not even know I had!



I apologize for not listing those who attended the event through CCCA.





# **San Jose History Tour**


